## CHAMPAGNE

Grower Champagne, or “farmer fizz” as it is sometimes endearingly called is one of the most exciting markets in the current wine world. The Champagne industry is historically based on very large companies who buy grapes, juice, wine or finished Champagne and blend it to produce their signature house style. While this creates a consistent product it tends to lose the subtleties of small specific areas within Champagne.

Grower Champagne delves into the flavors of each of the areas of Champagne, delivering a style of wine that speaks of its specific origin within the Champagne area. The farmers below all own their own land, grow their own grapes, make their own wine and produce their own Champagne.

Often due to small family holdings these wines are produced in extremely small quantities.

...the bubbles are lavish, fulsome and weighty with superb orchard fruit and almond milk	
VILMART & CIE Grand Cellier (Rilly la Montagne)	175
...fantastic complexity with toasty brioche, caramelized apple, quince and chalky mineral	
DIEBOLT-VALLOIS Blanc de Blancs Cramant Grand Cru Mis en Cave 1983 (Cramant)	250
...this went into the cellar in 1983 only to emerge recently...wild mushroom, crème caramel and very soft bubbles	
VARNIER-FANNIERE Rosé Grand Cru (Avize)	145
...full nose of wild strawberry, biscuit and cherry custard	
H. BILLIOT Rosé Grand Cru (Ambonnay)	135
...supple bubbles caress the mouth with a frothy delight of fresh strawberries, cherry pit and a hint of fennel

## Select White

### 2005 MARC MOREY St Aubin Les Charmois 1er Cru (Burgundy, France)

The domaine of Marc Morey has been imbedded in Burgundian history since 1919 when the domaine took shape. Known for precise and precocious wines, this domaine delivers robust and mineral driven whites. St Aubin has long been heralded as excellent value due to its proximity to the great Grand Cru vineyards of Chassagne-Montrachet and Puligny-Montrachet. The Charmois Vineyard is a stone's throw, granted a high one as its elevation is quite noticeable when standing staring at it, from Chevalier-Montrachet, a wine that can cost as much as ten times the price of this charming little gem.

### 2003 ZIND-HUMBRECHT Riesling Heimboung ~Indice 1~ (Alsace, France)

Olivier Humbrecht is a towering figure, not only in his physical stature, but in his standing within the international winecommunity. Considered one of the wine world's greatest winemakers, Oliver Humbrecht fashions wine much like his own self...brooding, intensely concentrated, earth driven and maniacally focused on the taste of terroir. The Heimboung vineyard, which used to be part of the Grand Cru Brand, is situated near the village of Turckheim. The soil here is rocky limestone giving the wine a light chalky minerality and a firm structure. The wine is dry offering superb notes of apple, meadow flower and a hint of camphor.

### 1992 R. LÓPEZ DE HEREDIA Viña Tondonia Reserva (Rioja, Spain)

Influenced by the beauty of Rioja and from French negociants, Don Rafael López de Heredia y Landeta founded his eponymous winery in the town of Haro in Rioja Alta in 1877. The winery is steeped in traditions and is one of the only wineries left in Rioja that make wine as they did in the late 19th century. This stunning white is made from Viura and Malvasia. The wine spends six years in oak barrels and then is aged further in the bottle. This lengthy sojourn in wood adds spicy notes of clove and vanilla, it adds structure and a creamy soft butterscotch note from delicate oxidization. A true rarity.

### 2006 DI ZAMO Fruilano Vigne Cinquant'Anni (Colli Orientali del Friuli, Italy)

Tullio Zamò began the family wine business with a purchases of 5ha of land in 1978. Vines were purchased on the RoccaBernarda, arguably the most famous slopes in the heart of Colli Orientali. This northeast part of Italy, bordering Slovenia, gained international reputation in the early 1970's for producing wines from Fruilano, Pinot Bianco, Pinot Grigio and Sauvignon Blanc. The Zamòs invested in high tech fermentation equipment, allowing their wines to be fresh, crisp, and floral, something relatively rare for Italian white wine at the time. The Fruilano Vigne Cinquant'Anni is harvested from 60 year old vines. It spends ten months on the lees, with partial malolactic fermentation. The result is a dense white wine with savory acids and intense meadow flowers, rising bread dough and warm apple peel.  
A wine too decant and serve mildly chilled.

## Select Red

### 1998 NICOLAS POTEL Pommard Les Bertins Premier Cru (Burgundy, France)

Nicolas Potel grew up with wine in his nursing bottle. His father was the great Gérard Potel of Volnay domaine, La Pousse d'Or. Nicolas's wines are well known for their purity and succinct terroir attributes. His wines, especially his Premier Cru and Grand Cru selections, often require some patience in the cellar before they blossom to show their entire personality. The 1998 vintage was one with a tricky spring, a drought summer and after some rain a smooth harvest. Softening tannins and juicy acidity reveal cranberry and hung game notes.

### 2004 MARION Valpolicella Superiore (Veneto, Italy)

The winery is housed on an estate that was built by the Counts Marioni in the 15th century. The Campedelli family bought the estate in 1988, renovated the buildings and for the first time on the property planted vineyards. Most of the production in the early years was sold to a local co-op, but in 1999 the first label from Marion was released. The family hired winemaker Celestino Gaspari to make the wines. Gaspari's previous post was with Quintarelli for eleven years and was consulting wine maker for Dal Forno for some time. The wine shows a light ruby hue with aromas of worn saddle leather, turned black earth, tree bark, clove and ripe cherry. Despite its inherent concentration the wine is quite elegant.

### 2003 G.D. VAJRA Barolo Bricco delle Viole (Piedmont, Italy)

The Vajra family has two centuries of farming history around the town Vergne in the commune of Barolo. In 1972 Aldo Vajra decided to start his own winery, a time when most people in Italy were leaving the doldrums of rural life. For most of the early years Aldo spent his days as professor of wine making in Alba, maintaining the vineyards and winery at night and on weekends with his wife Milena. The 2ha Bricco delle Viole vineyard faces south and southeast at an altitude of 450 meters. It has soils of limestone and clay and was planted in 1949 by Aldo's grandfather. The vineyard usually produces nervy wines with a high mineral nuance and wonderful clarity. The extremely hot temperatures of 2003 enabled the wine to be a little fatter than usual, adding to its earlier drinkability. Notes of cold sandstone, rose bush, Earl Grey tea, beef bones, worn leather.

### 2005 SINE QUA NON Atlantis Fe 203 1A Syrah (California, United States)

One would be hard pressed to find a harder wine to secure than Elaine and Manfred Krankl's Sine Qua Non. The name itself Sine Qua non means, an essential element or something one cannot be without. Seems fitting for such an awe inspiring wine. The couple is based in the back roads of Ventura, while still purchasing some fruit they farm greater amounts each year from their Eleven Confessions vineyard. A perfect wine in many eyes, this elixir of Syrah will float on your palate deepening its pressure as it swathes across your tongue. Essence of blackberry, rich bacon fat, campfire smoke and crushed black mineral.
